Welcome & Introduction:

Confirm 1: to give approval to: ratify 2: to make firm or firmer 3: to administer the rite of confirmation to 4: verify, corroborate

Confirmation 1: a religious ceremony admitting a person to full membership in the church

Sacraments are not just events but paths into new ways of living:

Understanding the reality of our faith is accessible and present to us and others as we become representatives of Christ to a world in need.

- We believe that in our Sacraments of faith, we meet Jesus and change.
 - 7 Sacraments
 - Of Initiation: Baptism – Eucharist – Confirmation
 - Of Healing: Reconciliation – Anointing of the Sick
 - At the Service of Communion: Matrimony – Holy Orders
- Just believing is not enough.
 - A believer makes a Difference...
 - “Come, be my disciples, and I will show you how to fish for Men.” Mat 4:19
- Qualifications for Confirmation Sponsors
 - Sponsor MUST have completed all the Sacraments of Initiation
 - If Married – Marriage Certificate from the Catholic Church
 - Sponsor MUST request a letter from their parish of participation
 - Confirmandi MUST now have a Saint Name, Two-page report on: Why they want to be confirmed, and Why they chose their Saint and Sponsor.
